

Phlebotomy Training

Live Bloods Clinic Sessions (Stage 2)

Course ID: FA-S2LBS | **Duration**: Half-Day Sessions (2 Mornings) or Full-Day Sessions (1 Morning & 1 Afternoon)

(hours may vary depending on how busy the clinic is with patients)

Dates: Arranged Individually (the standard wait time for Stage 2 training is minimum 2-3 weeks after once Stage 1 training is completed)

Price: £290 for two sessions (Minimum booking is for two sessions. Thereafter, each session is priced at £130)

Course Description

The last stage of our Phlebotomy Training takes places in an NHS facility and gives you the opportunity to take blood from real patients under the one-to-one supervision of a Floreo trainer. Here, you will develop your technical and interpersonal skills in an authentic clinical setting, performing the procedures you will regularly carry out as a practicing phlebotomist. On completion, you will be issued with a **Certificate of Competency** awarded jointly with the NHS facility in which you train.

The time it takes to achieve competency varies from individual to individual - two sessions is often sufficient to develop the necessary level of knowledge and skills, but this will remain at the discretion of the trainer assessing your performance.

Entry Requirements

- Aged 18 or over
- Hepatitis B vaccinated (1st Jab Only) and Covid-19 (both 1st & 2nd Jab)
- Completion of our Introductory Course (Stage-1)

- ✓ How to prepare individuals for obtaining venous blood and managing personal beliefs and preferences

Certificates & Progression
